

# Pond Ripple by FusionBeads.com



Approximate finished length: 7 inches

## **Beads and other products needed for one bracelet:**

- 1 - Size 11 Silver Lined Matte Gray Light Aqua Round Japanese Seed Beads (SB1682)
- 2 - Size 8 Inside Color Lined Crystal/Aqua Delica Beads - DBL0904 (08DB0904)
- 1 - 16mm Crystal Foiled Swarovski Elements Crystal 2 Hole Rivoli Button (CB0516)
- 12 feet - Turquoise Nymo Nylon Thread Size D (SM0746)

## **Tools needed to complete the bracelet:**

Scissors  
Size 10 English Beading Needles  
Perfect End Thread Burner (TL1006)

## **Beading Techniques needed to complete the bracelet:**

Flat Peyote Stitch – Even Count  
Flat Peyote Clasp – Option 3  
Using a Thread Burner  
Picot Fringe

## **Instructions to complete “Pond Ripple” bracelet:**

### **Step 1**

Thread a needle with approximately 5 feet of beading thread (add new thread as needed) and, leaving a tail approximately 1 foot long, string four size 8 Delica beads. Using flat peyote stitch (see Flat Peyote Stitch – Even Count Technique), weave the bracelet using the Delica beads until the desired length is reached.

### **Step 2**

Weave the needle through beads until it exits the second bead on the last row. String 34 size 11 seed beads, and pass through the third Delica bead, forming a loop (see Flat Peyote Clasp – Option 3). Reinforce this loop at least three times. Weave back and forth through a few rows, and trim the thread with the Perfect End Thread Burner (see Using a Thread Burner Technique).

### **Step 3**

Thread the needle onto the tail you left behind at the other end of the bracelet, and weave down through the first three rows until you reach the third column bead (to align with the placement of the loop made in Step 2). String one hole in the button, and pass through the second hole in the button. Pass back through several beads in the bracelet, and reinforce the button attachment at least three times.

### **Step 4**

Using the same thread or, if more is needed, anchoring a new thread, exit from a corner bead. Using size 11 beads, stitch a picot fringe (see Picot Fringe Technique) on both long edges of the bracelet. Weave the thread back and forth through a few beads, and burn the end.

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
