Approximate finished length: 18 inches

Beads and other products needed for one necklace:

- 24 - 3mm Ruby Round Czech Pressed Glass Beads (GL1138)
- 10 - 8x6mm Peridot Opal Flat Oval Czech Pressed Glass Beads (GL8230)
- 1 - 20x9mm Peridot Opal Teardrop Czech Pressed Glass Bead (GL7810)
- 2 - 5mm 18 gauge Gold Plated Base Metal Jump Rings (BM2833)
- 1 - 16x13mm Antique Gold Plated Pewter Classic M Hook by TierraCast (GP2420)
- 12 inches - 2.3mm Gold Plated Base Metal Long and Short Chain (CN3003)
- 3 - 22 gauge Gold Plated Brass 1.5 inch Head Pins (BM2700)
- 11 - 22 gauge Gold Plated Brass 2 inch Eye Pins (BM2664)

Tools needed to complete the necklace:

- Round nose pliers
- Chain nose pliers
- Wire cutters

Beading Techniques needed to complete the necklace:

- Opening and Closing a Jump Ring
- Cutting Chain Efficiently
- Simple Loop

Instructions to complete “On Golden Pond” necklace:

Step 1

The chain is made of oval links alternating with three small round links. Cut the chain into nine 1-inch lengths (see Cutting Chain Efficiently Technique) so that each length begins and ends with an oval link.

Step 2

Place one 3mm ruby glass bead, one 8x6mm peridot opal flat oval glass bead and one 3mm ruby glass bead onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop (see Simple Loop Technique) at the open end of the eye pin. Attach the loop just made to one jump ring.

Step 3

Open the second loop on the unit from the previous step, and attach it to one end link of one length of chain.

Step 4

Place one 3mm ruby glass bead, one 8x6mm peridot opal flat oval glass bead and one 3mm ruby glass bead onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop at the open end of the eye pin. Attach the loop just made to the second end link of chain used in the previous step.

Step 5

Repeat Steps 3 – 4 eight times.

Step 6

Open one jump ring (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique). Use the jump ring to connect the last unattached loop from the previous step to one side of the M hook. Close the jump ring.

Step 7

Place one 3mm ruby glass bead onto one head pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop at the open end of the head pin. Attach the loop just made to the eye of one eye pin.

Step 8

Repeat Step 7 twice, attaching a total of three 3mm ruby glass bead units to the same eye pin.

Step 9

Place the 20x9mm Peridot Opal Teardrop (wide end first) and one 3mm ruby glass bead onto the eye pin used in Steps 7 – 8. Turn a simple loop at the open end of the head pin. Attach the loop just made to the other side of the M hook.

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
