Approximate finished length: 20 inches

Beads and other products needed for one necklace:

- 22 crystals - SS7 Light Siam Swarovski Elements Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1206)
- 22 crystals - SS7 Crystal Swarovski Elements Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1173)
- 22 crystals - SS7 Emerald Swarovski Elements Crystal Flat Back Rhinestones (FT1188)
- 7 - 14mm Emerald Round Czech Pressed Glass Beads (GL8481)
- 1 - 45mm Antique Brass Wreath Filigree by Kabela Design (BM2216)
- 12.5 inches - 4mm Natural Brass Petite Etched Cable Chain by Vintaj (CN5230)
- 1 - 15x10mm Natural Brass Swirl Hook and Eye Clasp Set by Vintaj (NB0249)
- 7 - 1.5 inch 22 gauge Natural Brass Eye Pins by Vintaj (NB0176)

Tools needed to complete the necklace:

- Round nose pliers
- Chain nose pliers
- Wire cutters
- Jewel Setter or tweezers
- 5 Minute Epoxy (TL1938)

Beading Techniques needed to complete the necklace:

- Opening and Closing a Jump Ring
- Simple Loop
- Gluing Flat Back Rhinestones

Instructions to complete “Festivity” necklace:

Step 1

Dot a small drop of 5 Minute Epoxy onto one space just inside the edge of the center hole in the filigree. Using a Jewel Setter or tweezers, carefully place one Crystal flat back rhinestone onto the epoxy. Allow the epoxy to dry (see Gluing Flat Back Rhinestones Technique).

Step 2

Repeat Step 1 with the remaining Crystal flat back rhinestones around the center hole.

Step 3

In the same manner as in the previous steps, glue one Light Siam flat back rhinestone beside each Crystal flat back rhinestone.

Step 4

In the same manner as in the previous steps, glue one Emerald flat back rhinestone near each “petal” point at the outer edge of the filigree.

Step 5

Using wire cutters, cut the chain into two 6.25-inch lengths.

Step 6

The unsoldered links of the chain can be opened and closed like jump rings. Open one end link of one chain length (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique), and attach it to any one petal point on the filigree. Close the link.

Step 7

Place one glass bead onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop (see Simple Loop Technique) at the open end of the eye pin. Attach the loop just made to the petal point on the filigree directly across from the one used in the previous step.

Step 8

Place one glass bead onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop at the open end of the eye pin. Attach the loop just made to the unattached loop on the unit from the previous step.

Step 9

In the same manner as in the previous step, make and attach five more units using glass beads, one bead per unit.

Step 10

Open the unattached loop on the last unit made in the previous step, and attach it to one end link of the second length of chain. Close the loop.

Step 11

Open the loop on the hook side of the clasp, and attach it to one end of the necklace. Close the loop.

Step 12

Open the end chain link on the other end of the necklace, and attach it to the ring side of the clasp. Close the link.

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
