- 27 - 4mm Black Diamond Fire Polished Round Glass Beads (FP0233)
- 18 - 4mm Emerald Fire Polished Round Glass Beads (FP0237)
- 18 - 4mm Fuchsia Fire Polished Round Glass Beads (FP0362)
- 26 - 4mm Green Olivine Fire Polished Round Glass Beads (FP2387)
- 18 - 0.38x11.5mm Silver Plated Base Metal 3 Strand Spacer Bars (BM3111)
- 1 - 13mm Sterling Silver Round Toggle Clasp (SS3864)
- 2 - 5.5mm Sterling Silver 19 Gauge Open Jump Rings (SS3950)
- 6 - 2x2mm Sterling Silver Crimp Beads (SS4047)
- 6 - 3.5mm Sterling Silver Crimp Bead Covers (SS2103)
- 2 - 8x13mm Sterling Silver 3 Hole End Bar Links (SS2407)
- 24 inches - Clear Soft Flex Beading Wire .014 Diameter (SM0310)

Tools needed to complete the bracelet:

- Wire cutters
- Chain nose pliers
- Crimping pliers (TL0500)

Beading Techniques needed to complete the bracelet:

- Opening and Closing a Jump Ring
- Crimping
- Crimp Bead Covers

Instructions to complete “Get Together” bracelet:

Tip

The bracelet is made of three strung strands connected with 18 spacer bars. Imagine that the three strands are numbered from 1 – 3, with the corresponding holes in the spacer bars also numbered from 1 – 3.

Step 1

Using wire cutters, cut the beading wire into three 8-inch lengths.

Step 2

Place one crimp bead and loop 1 on one end bar link onto an 8-inch length of beading wire. Pass the wire back through the crimp bead, and crimp the crimp bead (see Crimping Technique).

Step 3

Cover the crimp bead with a crimp bead cover (see Crimp Bead Covers Technique), and trim excess wire with wire cutters.

Step 4

Repeat Steps 2 – 3 twice, crimping a second length of beading wire onto loop 2 and a third onto loop 3 of the same end bar link.

Step 5

String these beads in the following sequence onto the three strands of beading wire:

Strand 1:

2 – green olivine fire polished beads
hole 1 of spacer bar 1
1 – black diamond fire polished bead
hole 1 of spacer bar 2
3 – fuchsia fire polished beads
hole 1 of spacer bar 3
1 – black diamond fire polished bead
hole 1 of spacer bar 4
1 – emerald fire polished bead
hole 1 of spacer bar 5
1 – black diamond fire polished bead
hole 1 of spacer bar 6
3 – green olivine fire polished beads
hole 1 of spacer bar 7
1 – black diamond fire polished bead

Step 5

String one crimp bead and the corresponding loop on the second end bar link onto strand 1. Pass the wire back through the crimp bead, and crimp the crimp bead. Cover the crimp with a crimp bead cover, and trim excess wire with wire cutters.

Step 6

Repeat Step 5 with each of the two remaining strands of beading wire, crimping each onto the corresponding loop on the end bar clasp.

Step 7

Open two jump rings (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique). Use one jump ring to attach one side of the toggle clasp to the loop on one end bar link and the other jump ring to attach the second side of the clasp to the loop on the second end bar link. Close both jump rings.

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
