

Heart and Solarium by FusionBeads.com



Approximate finished length: 8 inches

Beads and other products needed for one bracelet:

- 8 - 3mm Olivine Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (03BI1115)
- 12 - 3mm Sunflower Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (03BI1401)
- 12 - 3mm Smoked Topaz Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (03BI1134)
- 1 - 10.5mm Olivine Swarovski Elements Crystal Rivoli Stone (SC7255)
- 1 - 25.5mm Natural Brass Attic Window Link by Vintaj (NB0344)
- 1 - 8.38 inch Long Red Brown 1.25 inch Wide Split Suede Cuff Bracelet (CR0823)
- 5 feet - 26 Gauge Vintage Bronze Wire (VW0105)
- 1 - Smoke Gray FireLine Braided Bead Thread .009 diameter, 8 lb (SM4819)

Tools needed to complete the bracelet:

- Wire cutters
- Chain nose pliers
- Size 10 English Beading Needles (TL1646)
- 5 Minute Epoxy (TL1938)

Beading Techniques needed to complete the bracelet:

- Covering a Component - Surface
- Gluing Swarovski Elements Crystal Rivoli Stones into a Rivoli Component

Instructions to complete “Heart and Solarium” bracelet:

Step 1

Following the directions on the package, mix the 5 Minute Epoxy (see Gluing Swarovski Elements Crystal Rivoli Stones into a Rivoli Component Technique).

Step 2

Place a drop of epoxy in the center of the window link. Place one 10.5mm crystal Rivoli stone onto the epoxy, and press firmly. Allow to dry.

Step 3

Anchor a 5-foot length of wire to one corner of the window link (see Covering a Component – Surface Technique). Working in a clockwise direction, attach these crystal bicone beads to the edge of the link in the following sequence:

- 1 – 3mm Sunflower bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Olivine bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Smoked Topaz bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Sunflower bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Smoked Topaz bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Sunflower bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Olivine bicone bead
- 1 – 3mm Smoked Topaz bicone bead

You should reach the next corner with the last bead. Repeat the sequence three times, covering all four sides of the link.

Step 4

Apply a thin coat of epoxy to the back of the link. Position the link diagonally and adhere it to the center of the suede cuff. Allow the epoxy to dry.

Step 5

Thread a needle with an 18-inch length of beading thread. Tie knots in one end of the thread, and sew through the suede cuff under one corner of the link.

Step 6

Sew through the corner of the link, pass the thread around the edge of the link, and sew back down through the cuff.

Step 7

In the same manner as in the previous step, continue sewing the link to the cuff until it is securely fastened on all four sides.

Step 8

Secure the thread with knots on the back side of the cuff, and trim the thread.

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
