

# Purple Infusion by FusionBeads.com



Approximate finished length: 18 inches

## **Beads and other products needed for one necklace:**

- 2 - 3mm Silver Plated Base Metal Seamed Round Beads (BM2560)
- 9 - 5x7mm Antique Silver Plated Pewter Beaded Beads by TierraCast® (SP0180)
- 5 - 6x10mm Silver Plated Pewter Joy Large Hole Beads by TierraCast® (SP2347)
- 6 - 7.5x10mm Silver Plated Pewter Oasis Large Hole Beads by TierraCast® (SP2346)
- 1 - 21.5x10.5mm Antique Silver Plated Pewter S Clasp (PW1585)
- 2 - 6mm Sterling Silver 18 Gauge Closed Jump Rings (SS3977)
- 8 - 7x3.5mm Silver Plated Base Metal Cord Ends (BM3000)
- 2 - 16x9mm Antique Silver Plated Pewter Crater Textured Bead Cones (PW1060)
- 2 - 2mm Metallic Berry Round Leather Cord (SM5112)
- 1 - 22 Gauge Non-Tarnish Silver Artistic Wire (AW2084)

## **Tools needed to complete the necklace:**

- Round nose pliers
- Chain nose pliers
- Wire cutters
- Scissors
- E6000 Adhesive (TL1681)

## **Beading Techniques needed to complete the necklace:**

- Opening and Closing a Jump Ring
- Wire Wrapped Link
- Attaching a Cord End - Style 4

## **Instructions to complete “Purple Infusion” necklace:**

### **Step 1**

Using scissors, cut the leather cord into the following lengths (the letters A – D will be used to refer to the cord lengths in upcoming steps):

1 – 16.5” (A)

1 – 16.75” (B)

1 – 17” (C)

1 – 17.25” (D)

### **Step 2**

Apply a drop of E6000 adhesive to cord A about 6 inches from one end, string one 5x7mm beaded bead, and slide the bead over the drop of glue to secure it.

### **Step 3**

In the same manner as in the previous step, continue stringing and gluing these beads in the following sequence onto cord A, allowing the specified lengths before each bead:

2 inches: 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

1.75 inches: 1 – 6x10mm joy large hole bead

### **Step 4**

In the same manner as in the previous steps, string and glue these beads in the following sequence onto the remaining cords, allowing the specified lengths before each bead:

#### **Cord B**

4 inches (from end): 1 – 6x10mm joy large hole bead

2.75 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

3 inches: 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

2.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

#### **Cord C**

3.5 inches (from end): 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

2 inches: 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

2 inches: 1 – 6x10mm joy large hole bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 6x10mm joy large hole bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

#### **Cord D**

4.5 inches (from end): 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

2.5 inches: 1 – 6x10mm joy large hole bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

2 inches: 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 5x7mm beaded bead

1.5 inches: 1 – 7.5x10mm oasis large hole bead

### **Step 5**

Attach a cord end to one end of cord A (see Attaching a Cord End - Style 4 Technique).

### **Step 6**

Repeat Step 5 with one end of each of the remaining cords.

### **Step 7**

Using a 3-inch length of wire, string the loops on the four cord ends onto the wire, and make a wire wrapped loop (see Wire Wrapped Link Technique) on the wire.

**Step 8**

Place one cone onto the open side of the wire, string one seamed round bead onto the wire, and push the cone and bead down about a half inch so that the completed end of the wire wrap and the cord ends are concealed by the cone (see Multi-Strand Piece with Cones Technique).

**Step 9**

Repeat Steps 5 – 8 on the other end of the necklace.

**Step 10**

Open two jump rings (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique). Use one jump ring to attach the S clasp to the loop on one end of the necklace. Attach the other jump ring to the loop on the other end of the necklace. Close both jump rings.

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
