

# Just Dazzle Me by FusionBeads.com

- 9 - 4mm Emerald Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (04BI1120)
- 9 - 4mm Light Turquoise Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (04BI1474)
- 9 - 4mm Denim Blue Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (04BI1467)
- 9 - 4mm Olivine Swarovski Elements Crystal Bicone Beads (04BI1117)
- 9 - 4mm Light Green Swarovski Elements Crystal Pearls (PL5008)

## **Tools needed to complete the bracelet:**

Round nose pliers  
Chain nose pliers  
Wire cutters

## **Beading Techniques needed to complete the bracelet:**

Opening and Closing a Jump Ring  
Wire Wrapping  
Simple Loop

## **Instructions to complete “Just Dazzle Me” bracelet:**

### **Step 1**

Open one jump ring (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique), and use it to attach the lobster claw to one hole in one 14mm Blue Zircon crystal Chessboard sew-on stone. Close the jump ring.

### **Step 2**

Open a second jump ring (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique), and attach it to the second hole in the same sew-on stone. Close the jump ring.

### **Step 3**

Open one jump ring (see Opening and Closing a Jump Ring Technique), and attach it to one hole in one 14mm Blue Zircon crystal Chessboard sew-on stone. Close the jump ring.

### **Step 4**

Repeat Step 3 with a second jump ring and the second hole in the same sew-on stone.

### **Step 3**

Repeat Steps 3 – 4 with the remaining sew-on stones.

### **Step 4**

Place one 12mm Petrol coin pearl onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop (see Simple Loop Technique) at the open end of the eye pin and attach it to one of the jump rings on one of the sew-on stones.

### **Step 5**

Open the unattached loop on the unit from the previous step, and attach it to one jump ring on a second sew-on stone. Close the loop.

### **Step 6**

Place one 12mm Petrol coin pearl onto one eye pin, making one unit. Turn a simple loop at the open end of the eye pin. Attach the loop just made to the second jump ring on the sew-on stone from the previous step. Close the loop.

### **Step 7**

In the same manner as in Steps 5 – 6, continue alternating coin pearls and Chessboard sew-on stones, attaching them with simple loops on eye pins. For the last coin pearl, you will attach one loop to a sew-on stone and the other loop to the 6mm closed jump ring that will serve as part of the clasp.

### **Tip**

*In the next steps, wire wrapped loops on head pins will be used to attach the 4mm crystal bicone beads and 4mm crystal pearls randomly to the jump rings between the coin pearls and Chessboard sew-on stones. Attach one bead of each color to each jump ring.*

### **Step 8**

Place any one 4mm bead (bicone or crystal pearl) onto a head pin, making one unit. Wire wrap (see Wire Wrapping Technique) this unit to the first jump ring linking one coin pearl and one sew-on stone.

### **Step 9**

Repeat Step 8 with each of the remaining bicone and crystal pearl bead colors, attaching a total of 11 beads to the same jump ring.

### **Step 10**

Repeat Steps 8 – 9 with each of the remaining jump rings.
