Approximate finished length: 21 inches (triple-wrapped)

Beads and other products needed for one bracelet:

88 beads - True 2mm Round Fire Polished Czech Glass Beads by Beadsmith - 24K Gold Plated Glass (FP3983) (A)

70 beads- True 2mm Round Fire Polished Czech Glass Bead by Beadsmith - Alabaster Pastel Dark Coral (FP4026) (B)

70 beads - True 2mm Round Fire Polished Czech Glass Bead by Beadsmith - Alabaster Pastel White (FP4025) (C)

1 - Pewter Round Textured Bullseye Button - Gold - 12mm (PW0300)

54 inches - Round Leather Cord - Natural - 1.5mm (SM5068)

1 - Superlon Beading Thread - Light Brown - Size D (SM4318)

Tools needed to complete the bracelet:

Tulip Beading Needles - Size 11 (TL2648)

Hypo Tube Cement (TL1202)

Xuron Thread and Fiber Scissors (TL3000)

Beading Techniques needed to complete the bracelet:

Wrapped Cord Bracelet



Instructions to complete “Wrapped in Style” bracelet:

Tip

The letters A – C designate the beads used in the pattern. Please refer to the materials list above for the key.

Step 1

Using scissors, cut a 54-inch length of cord.

Step 2

String the button onto the cord to the middle of the cord (see Wrapped Cord Bracelet Technique).

Step 3

Tie an overhand knot just below the button.



Step 4

Thread a needle with 8 feet of beading thread, and tie a knot in the doubled thread.



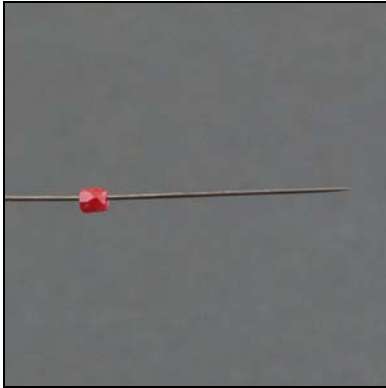
Step 5

Attach the thread to the cord with a lark's head knot.



Step 6

String 1 – B with the threaded needle.



Step 7

Pull the thread under both pieces of cord.

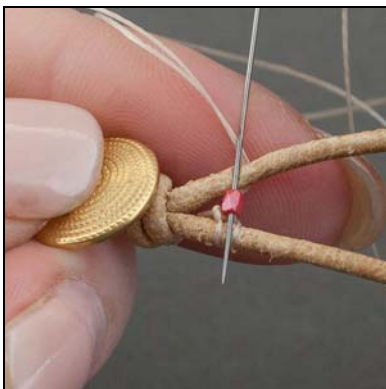
Step 8

Push the bead up between the two pieces of cord.



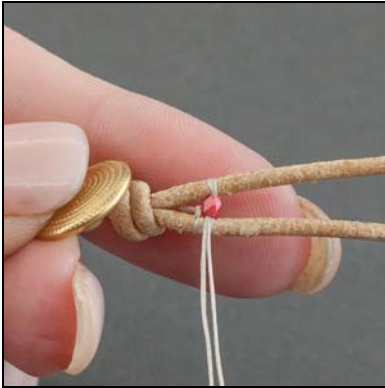
Step 9

Pass back through the bead.



Step 10

Pull the thread taut.



Step 11

Repeat Steps 6 – 11 using these beads in the following sequence, stitching one bead at a time:

9 – B

1 – A

10 – B

1 – A

10 – B

1 – A

10 – B

1 – A

10 – B

1 – A

10 – B

1 – A

10 – B

76 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C

1 – A

10 – C



Step 12

To finish off the thread, pass the needle under one cord.

**Step 13**

Tie a double knot around the thread.

Step 14

Trim excess thread near the knots. Dab Hypo-Tube cement onto the knots.

**Step 15**

Tie an overhand knot with both pieces of cord directly below the last bead. Pull the knot tight.



Step 16

To make the right size buttonhole, pinch the two strands of cord together and slip the button in between the cords. Tie an overhand knot. Trim excess cord.
