

# All In A Line Cuff Bracelet by FusionBeads.com



Approximate finished length: adjustable

## **Beads and other products needed for a bracelet:**

- 1 gram - Size 11 Vermilion Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2108 (11DB2108) (A)
- 1 gram - Size 11 Light Maroon Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2119 (11DB2119) (B)
- 1 gram - Size 11 Tiffany Blue Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2133 (11DB2133) (C)
- 1 gram - Size 11 Yellow Marigold Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2103 (11DB2103) (D)
- 1 gram - Size 11 Opaque Black Delica Beads - DB0010 (11DB0010) (E)
- 1 - Gold Plated Centerline Cuff - 5.5 inch (BM5484)
- 1 - Superlon Beading Thread - Red - Size D (SM4327)

## **Tools needed to complete the bracelet:**

- Tulip Beading Needles - Size 11 (TL2648)
- Beading Scissors
- Hypo Tube Cement (optional)

## **Instructions to complete “All In A Line” bracelet:**

### **Step 1**

Thread a needle onto each end of a 3 foot length of thread.

### **Step 2**

Starting at one end of the cuff bracelet, use one needle to go down through first hole on the left side of the opening.

### **Step 3**

String the following beads onto the right needle:

1 - Size 11 Opaque Black Delica Beads - DB0010 (E)

1 - Size 11 Tiffany Blue Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2133 (C)

1 - Size 11 Opaque Black Delica Beads - DB0010 (E)

Then go down through the first set of holes on the right side of the opening.

### **Step 4**

Step up to the next hole on both sides of the cuff opening and bring your needles up through the second set of holes.

### **Step 5**

String the following beads onto the right needle:

1 - Size 11 Tiffany Blue Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2133 (C)

1 - Size 11 Light Maroon Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2119 (B)

1 - Size 11 Tiffany Blue Duracoat Opaque Dyed Delica Beads - DB2133 (C)

Go through these beads again using the left needle. (Note: You will pass through each set of beads with each needle. The needles will continue switching sides for each row.)

### **Step 6**

Go down through the set of holes you came up in step 4 on both sides of the opening.

### **Step 7**

Step up to the next hole on both sides of the cuff opening and bring your needles up through the next set of holes.

### **Step 8**

Repeat steps 5-7 following the following bead pattern for each of the rows. You should have a total of 22 rows of beads.

Row 3 – A, C, A

Row 4 – D, A, D

Row 5 – A, E, A

Row 6 – E, E, E

Row 7 – E, B, E

Row 8 – B, A, B

Row 9 – A, D, A

Row 10 – D, C, D

Row 11 – C, C, C

Row 12 – C, B, C

Row 13 – C, C, C

Row 14 – D, C, D

Row 15 – A, D, A

Row 16 – B, A, B

Row 17 – E, B, E

Row 18 – E, E, E

Row 19 – A, E, A

Row 20 – D, A, D

Row 21 – A, C, A

Row 22 – C, B, C

**Step 9**

String the following beads for row 23 – E, C, E. Go down through the set of holes you came up in this step.

**Step 10**

Using the two threads, tie a surgeon's knot. Cut the thread close.

(Note: You can add a drop of Hypo Tube Cement on the knot for added security)
